Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

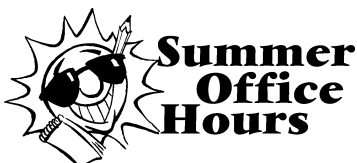
“It’s summer.” No, I’m not simply stating the obvious. I’m not pointing out that, as the school year comes to a close, we begin that season of the year when temperatures are warmer and outdoor activities increase. No. There is a temptation in those words. There is a history in those words. There is an excuse in those words.

The temptation? “It’s summer. Relax. Enjoy. Take some time off . . . from the Word, from church, from the Supper. There’s not as much going on at church or school in the summer as there is the rest of the year. We won’t miss anything. Besides, everyone’s attendance will slip a bit in summer. It’s no big deal. We’ll get back in the groove come fall.” Really? Bad habits are easy to form but awfully hard to break.

The history? We wouldn’t need to go back and check attendance totals from previous years for people to believe this (though we did). It would surprise none of you to hear that worship attendance drops significantly in the months of June, July and August (sometimes fewer than 200 people in worship over the weekend - down from our current average of over 300). Yes, people travel. Yes, people are on vacation. But should it ever become accepted by those who are in town to say, “Oh, well, yeah, it’s summer. Worship attendance goes way down. It does every year. People want to enjoy the outdoors. It will pick back up.” Is that really something we should simply accept or is it rather something we should address?

The excuse? “It’s summer. We had a late cook out Saturday night; we just couldn’t get up and at ‘em on Sunday (by 10:30?). I had an early golf game (what about Saturday night?). It’s the only day our family can have some family time so we wanted to do something together (as though family time in church in the Word isn’t family time well spent and a great start to the rest of the day). We were out of town (did you then look online for another WELS church or make time for a Sunday morning family devotion?).

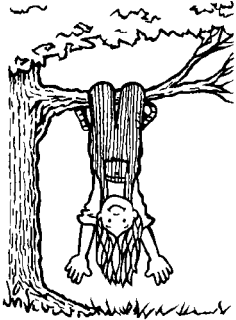
This is not simply an encouragement to not give up meeting together for worship this summer; this is a reminder that there is encouragement every time we meet together for worship. That encouragement is the Gospel. That encouragement is the amazing proclamation of our gracious and forgiving God that says, “I don’t hold those selfish attitudes toward worship and those misplaced priorities against you. More than that, because Jesus gave his life on the cross as payment for the world’s sin, I forgive you for the way you have treated me and my Word and the opportunities to gather around Word and Sacrament that I have given you.” Paid for. ## Support NELHS by purchasing SCRIP!!

Every first and second Sunday of the month, we have SCRIP for sale in the fellowship hall between services on Sunday. You don't know what SCRIP is? SCRIP is the gift cards and store certificates that you can purchase for face value, do your regular shopping with and ultimately help raise operating funds for Nebraska Ev. Lutheran High School (NELHS). As a non-profit organization, NELHS is able to purchase these various store gift cards at a discounted price. As mentioned, you can purchase the cards for face value (i.e., a \$25 Sears card costs you \$25!), and the GO-NELHS group slowly earns a small profit on each sale and eventually makes a donation to the school of the profits earned through your purchases. To date, NELHS has received over \$12,000 through the sales of SCRIP in many of the towns and cities that support the school.

A few examples of SCRIP that we typically have on-hand are: Applebees, Arby's, Bass Pro Shop, Best Buy, BP Gas Stations, Burger King, Cabelas, Gordmans, Hy-Vee, JCPenneys, Kohl's, Lowe's, Old Navy, Outback, Panera Bread, Red Lobster, Sears, ShopKo, Texas Roadhouse, Wal-Mart/Sam's Club, Walgreens, Menards, etc. Many other stores are available and can be ordered with an approximate week delivery.

So, remember, you can do your normal shopping with a little pre-planning using SCRIP and you will be helping NELHS in the process. You can also purchase SCRIP cards as gifts (like for your favorite called workers, Father's Day, Christmas, birthdays, etc.). An example of pre-planning was when Good Shepherd was planning on replacing the shingles on their parsonage. They pre-ordered Menards SCRIP to buy the shingles with and ended up helping NELHS in the process.

Remember, every first and second Sunday of the month, between services, in the fellowship hall. See Don M or Jay C. Any questions, please call the church office. Jay can email you a listing of the SCRIP that is available for order or the listing of SCRIP currently on-hand. He can usually help you with a rush request for SCRIP during the week also. Good Shepherd has the SCRIP supplies on the third Sunday and Living Hope has it on the fourth Sunday of each month. If there is a fifth Sunday, Gethsemane usually has it again.

There are two categories of charges:

- 1) A registration fee of \$150 per congregation which helps to cover the administrative cost of the workshop.
- 2) A general fee of \$20 for each individual participant  
For this fee, each participant will receive:
  - a) A 91-page workbook
  - b) A continental breakfast and lunch on Saturday, and refreshments throughout the weekend.

After you register, you will be sent documents via email that will prepare you for the School of Outreach. These include: instructions, congregational statistical reports, demographic reports and the community and congregational profiles and surveys. It will take a fair amount of time and effort to complete the surveys and profiles, so please start early and get everyone on your team involved. Information from these forms is important for your congregational planning. The completed forms are due 2 weeks prior to the session date.

Also at this time, you must verify the number of people that will be attending from your congregation. The Evangelism office uses this number to determine the amount of materials needed for the session, and the host congregation uses this number for meal planning and refreshments.

When the workshop has been completed, you will be invoiced for participant fees calculated by the attendance number you reported. Participants that exceed that number will be added to the congregational invoice at \$20 per person.

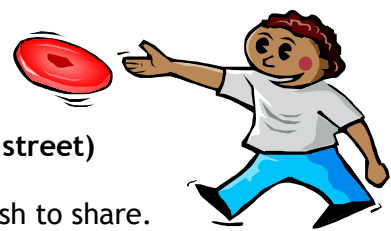

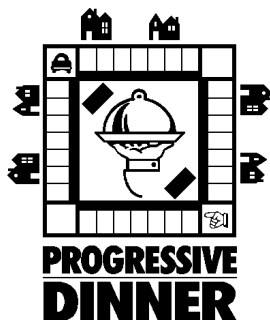

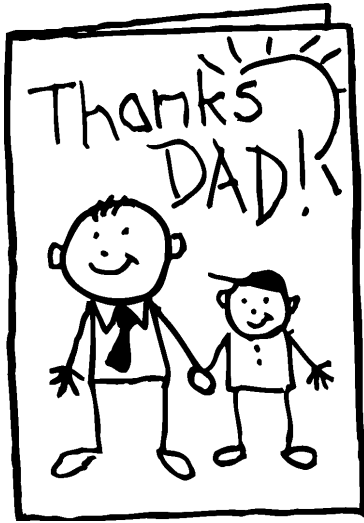
